



Support for families of deaf children

The National Deaf Children's Society and Family Fund have partnered to deliver a new UK-wide funding programme for families raising deaf children aged 0 to 11, or who are still in primary school.

The programme helps families access **assistive technology, specialist equipment and British Sign Language (BSL) learning**, supporting children to communicate, learn and take part fully in everyday life.

What funding is available?

You can apply for funding towards:

- assistive technology for hearing, communication or learning
- BSL learning for children and families
- computers or tablets to support communication and learning

Who can apply?

You may be eligible if:

- you are the main carer of a deaf child aged 0 to 11 (or still in primary education)
- your child has any level of hearing loss, including temporary or hearing loss in one ear
- you live anywhere in the UK

There is no income threshold. This programme has its own eligibility criteria, and you can apply even if you have received a Family Fund grant before.
