

Retubing an Earmould

It is important to replace earmould tubing if it becomes cracked, discoloured or very stiff.



1. Remove the old tubing taking care not to split the earmould



2. Take a new piece of tubing and taper one end by at least two centimetres.



3. Thread the tapered end of the tubing into the earmould and pull through until the bend of the tube is at approximately right angles to the earmould.



4. Cut the tubing so that it is 'flush' with the earmould at the end which is inserted into the ear



5. Compare the length of the old piece of tubing against the new one and mark where to cut it.



6. Place the hearing aid behind the wearer's ear and check the length of the tubing is correct before cutting it.
